Manitoba Lifeguard Championships – Scoring



Below is the formula for the scoring for the 2020 Manitoba Lifeguard Championship Competition.

Points for each event will be allocated based on the following table:

First Aid, Water Rescue and Priority Assessment fall under the Emergency Response column.

The relays (Manikin, Medley, Obstacle, Lifeguard Skills, Line Throw Relay) fall under the Physical Skills Team column; Line Throw, Manikin Carry and 100 m Obstacle are an individual physical skills. One person per gender (the fastest) per team will count for points for the individual events, though all members may compete.

Lifesaving Physical Skills competition

All events are instant finals.

The team with the highest total number of points (320 points max = 5 x 40 (relays) + 3 x 20 male + 3 x 20 female (individual)) will be deemed the Lifesaving Physical Skills Champion. For those teams competing for the Overall Championship their points will carry forward after being multiplied by 0.625 (to make the physical events worth 200 points total, or 40% of the competition weighting). See last sentence below. For example, if you win everything and have 320 points x 0.625 – 200 points contributing to your overall weekend points.

Lifeguarding Emergency Response competition

For events with multiple rounds (First Aid has 2, Priority has 2, and Water Rescue has 2) the table above will be used within each round and the rounds summed to determine the placing within the event (e.g., your team places 1st and 5th in the two First Aid rounds earning you 100 + 65 = 165 points. Suppose this ranks you second (i.e., one other team got more than 165 points between the three rounds) you would therefore earn 90 points for placing second in First Aid overall).

The team with the highest total number of points (300 points max) will be deemed the Lifeguarding Emergency Response Champion. For those teams competing for the Overall Championship their points will carry forward.

Manitoba Lifeguard Competition Overall Champion

For those teams that had the same competitors for the entire weekend (Physical Skills and Emergency Response competitions) their points from both competitions will be combined and the teams with the highest number of points (500 points max) will be deemed the Manitoba Lifeguard Competition Overall Champion.

The competition is weighted such that 40% of the points come from the Physical competition, and 60% of the points come from the Emergency Response competition.
